These are the election posters of Shin Ik-hee and Jang Myeon, the candidates from the Democratic Party for the 3rd and 4th presidential and vice presidential elections. The election campaign slogan from the Democratic Party at that time read; "We cannot live like this, let's completely change." The candidate Shin Ik-hee died in the midst of the election campaigning, and Jang Myeon was elected as the 4<sup>th</sup> Vice-President.



They are the election posters of the candidates of the Democratic Party, Jo Byeong-ok, and Jang Myeon. The election campaign slogan from the Democratic Party at that time read; “Let us get rid of fraudulent elections.” Since the candidate, Jo Byeong-ok died a month before the election, his photo was not published. It was the first time that the other item in the flesh was revealed apart from the photos.

<p>They are the bulletins for the revision of the Constitution made by the National Election Commission on September 18, 1969 before the 2<sup>nd</sup> referendum related with the revision of the Constitution to allow the third term of re-elections. The revisions included the number of the National Assembly members (Article 36(2)), holding of other posts other than being a National Assembly member (Article 39), a motion for impeachment (Article 61(2)), and the re-election of President.</p>

<p>This is a rubber stamp for making a name card-type advertising materials for candidates. It was designed by the campaign camp for Kwon tae-hyun, a candidate (No.8) running for a Gyeongsangnam-do council member during the first Si/Do council elections in the history of the Republic of Korea held on May 10, 1952. There are many existing resources for the name card-type advertising materials for candidates, however, since it is rare for a tool producing those advertising materials to be found, this rubber stamp is historically very significant.</p>

They are booklets of manual of election administration management execution instructions for election management published by the Ministry of Internal Affairs and the National Election Commission for the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> presidential, vice presidential and local elections held in 1956. They show the administrative procedures for election management before the establishment of the National Election Commission on January 21, 1963.

6. Books of Receipts of election expenses spent by the candidates of the 6<sup>th</sup> National Assembly Elections



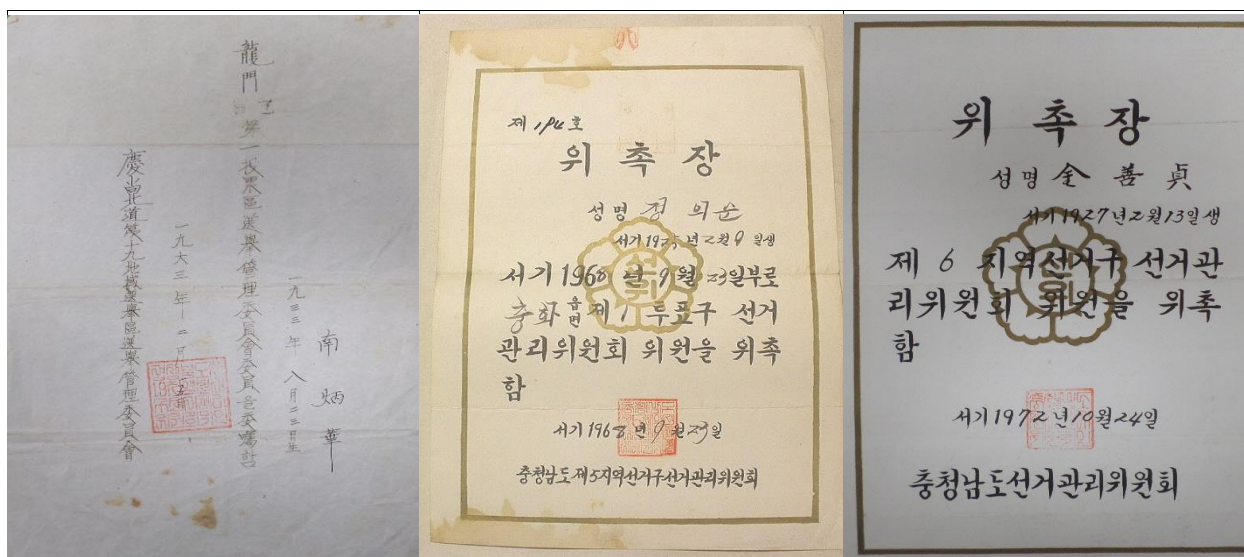
Books of Receipts of Election Expenses spent by the candidates of the 6<sup>th</sup> National Assembly Elections

They are the materials for Park Byeong-kyu, a candidate from the 10<sup>th</sup> constituency in Gyeongnam for the 6<sup>th</sup> National Assembly Elections held on November 26, 1963. They are compiled materials including receipts and reports of expenditure spent for the set up and operation of campaigning offices. They show the expenses of election campaigns and the relevant detailed information for that time.

**7. Advertising Materials for Candidates for the 5<sup>th</sup> National Assembly and Local Elections (Head of Do)**

<p>They are the advertising materials for the candidates for the 5<sup>th</sup> National Assembly (Upper and Lower House members) and local elections (Head of Do) that took place in 1960. They included bar signs, names of the nominating parties, candidates' profiles, and political views. The 5<sup>th</sup> National Assembly Elections were the first and the last election that consisted of bicameral house in the legislative history for the first time. Gubernatorial elections for electing a head of Do had never been carried out since until it was reintroduced again at the first nationwide simultaneous local elections in 1995.</p>

They are the letters of appointment for Nam Byeong-wha(1963), the commissioner of the 1st voting district election commission in Gyeongbuk Yecheon-gun Yongmun-myeon in 1963, for Jung Eui-soon, the commissioner of 1st voting district election commission in Chungnam Buyeo Chungghwa-eup in 1968, and for Kim Sun- jung, the commissioner of the 6th constituency election commission in Chungnam in 1972.
